Commissioner Barrera moved to table the minutes of the August 24, 2010 meeting. Commissioner Araujo seconded the motion, which was adopted unanimously.

Ms. Sandow requested to add an item to her report.

Ms. Sandow and Ms. Perkins reported on Borough Office post election activities. The information per borough follows:

Commissioner Stupp reported that the Queens Borough Office has completed the 3% Audit.

Ms. Perkins recalled that the entrance conference with the NYC Office of the Comptroller concerning the Procurement Audit is scheduled for tomorrow, November 17, 2010 at 12:00 P.M. Executive Management received requests for particular documents from the Office of the Comptroller's Auditor yesterday. A copy of the request is in the agenda. Board staff is currently compiling the documents requested.

Mr. Ward presented the Comparative Expenditures Report dated November 16, 2010. A copy of the report is in the agenda.

Mr. Ward reported that 27,000 poll workers have been paid in the new system to this date. He noted that approximately 2,700 Social Security numbers have been inadvertently entered incorrectly into the S-Select System and are currently being reviewed. The Financial Information Services Agency (FISA) and the Office of Payroll Administration (OPA) submitted that list of poll worker's names to the Board. The Board's MIS Department will sort the list of names per their respective borough. The Borough Offices' Poll Worker Department will verify and correct the names and Social Security numbers in the S-Select System. Mr. Ward stated that the data inputted into S-Select System should be transferred into the NYCAPS System as well. He reported that FISA wants to schedule a specific training meeting for the Board's Poll Worker Department staff. Commissioner Umane noted that the poll worker information that was entered into the computer system this year will not have to be re-inputted next year. Mr. Ward requested for one (1) representative from each borough's Poll Worker Department to attend the FISA training meeting. President Dent stated that the Commissioners will share his request with their respective Borough Office.

President Dent noted that Commissioner Soumas joined the meeting.

Commissioner Schacher moved to adjourn the meeting. Commissioner Umane seconded the motion, which was adopted unanimously.
