## PRESENT:

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(The meeting commenced at 3:33 p.m.)

MR. RAFAEL SAVINO: Cover sheet review committee. Fortunately, there is only one matter to review. It's Ms. Ahmed, who is running for 24th Council District. Basically, she has Mo for the People Party on the very top of her cover sheet, and then she has Mo for the People on the top of her independent nominating petition. That both matches, which would not be a defect, but in the body, it's that paragraph underneath, it just says, it says Mo for the People as the name of the independent body making the nomination.

There are some folks that say anything wrong in the top kills it, but I've been doing some research and the stuff I found so for is if you have the wrong type of election, you have the wrong date of election or if you're -- a cut and paste error and you have a complete different party there. So, it's certainly up to you guys.

COMMISSIONER GINA MARMORATO: Counselor,

I have a question, I have a question.

MR. SAVINO: Sure.

COMMISSIONER MARMORATO: So I see on the

3	MR. SAVINO: Mm-hmm.
4	COMMISSIONER MARMORATO: And see on the
5	independent nominating petition, it also says Mo
6	for the People Party.
7	MR. SAVINO: That's correct.
8	COMMISSIONER MARMORATO: Did you say
9	that there was a place in
10	MR. SAVINO: Well, if you look at the,
11	the body of the paragraph, that is required.
12	COMMISSIONER MARMORATO: Okay.
13	MR. SAVINO: To the Board of Elections,
14	I, the undersigned do hereby blah, blah,
15	blah. And it says eventually, I select the name
16	of Mo for the People as the name of the
17	independent body, the nomination as
18	[unintelligible] [00:05:04] such body.
19	PRESIDENT TAYLOR: It's the last line of
20	that first little paragraph, right?
21	MR. SAVINO: Correct. When he says the
22	name of my party is Mo for the People.
23	PRESIDENT TAYLOR: So the word party
24	should not be a part of it?
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2	COMMISSIONER MARMORATO: I think the
3	word party was meant to be included, but it was
4	not included in the body of the e-mail. I think
5	it but at the top, it does indicate Mo for the
6	Party People. So at the very top, the independent
7	nominating petition, my opinion, matches with
8	what the cover sheet, it matches the name of the
9	party.
10	PRESIDENT TAYLOR: The problem with that
11	is Mo for the People Party is too long isn't it?
12	MR. SAVINO: I think it's 14 characters.
13	I can double check again. But, you know, if we
14	sent them a letter, which is what, what we
15	normally do if it's too long. Let me count it
16	first, one, two, three, four, five
17	PRESIDENT TAYLOR: It's 14 characters if
18	it's just Mo for the People.
19	MR. SAVINO: Yeah, you're right. It's

PRESIDENT TAYLOR: If you throw in the word party, it makes it too long.

MR. SAVINO: Correct. In those cases, we will send the candidate a letter and they will

have the option of changing the name, they would probably just drop party, but I don't think that's really a part of their name in the first place. They have the opportunity to change it on their own. If they don't do it in a timely fashion then the commissioners pick a new name. Probably the best thing example I can think of, there's tons of examples, is the Rent is Too Damned High, so to shorten it a little bit, they did a number 2 instead of a too. So that's a curable defect. She'll be given an opportunity to cure it, you know, if you don't feel that this is a defect, you know, we'll certainly take care of that as well.

COMMISSIONER MARMORATO: So, is the term party included on every petition cover sheet and -- on the cover sheet and the independent petition?

MR. SAVINO: Well, this is a special.

COMMISSIONER MARMORATO: Right.

MR. SAVINO: So normally you have

Democratic Party, Republican Party, that sort of
thing. I honestly couldn't say. I'm sure I've

definitely seen it before, but I can't remember the last time. It might have been fairly recently. And it depends on how the commissioners feel about which way they rule but, yeah, this one seems to say party after every Mo for the Party except for that one that says Mo for the People as the name of the independent body making the nomination. So that, that's where we at.

PRESIDENT TAYLOR: So what we need to decide is whether we want to give them an opportunity to cure, or we want to accept this as being Mo for the People?

MR. SAVINO: Right. If you decide this is acceptable, there's really nothing else to do. If you decide that they have to remove the party I guess from the Mo for the People, then you would rule the [unintelligible] [00:08:01], I mean you'd rule this as a defect and then they'd get a letter overnight, and then they'd get some time to cure, three days. But I mean, at the end of the day quite frankly, the Mo for the People Party isn't that much of a problem because, because they do have that listed on the top of

the independent nominating petition. It just,
they just change it up a little bit as Mo for the
People as the name of the independent body making
the nomination. It, it's certainly not perfect
and ideal, but, you know, in your discretion, if
you don't feel it's a defect, that's one thing.
And if you do, we can certainly try and cure it,
or they can try and cure it.
PRESIDENT TAYLOR: But did I understand
you to say that if we sent them a letter and they
don't reply, then we can make the correction
ourselves?
MR. SAVINO: That's two different
issues.
PRESIDENT TAYLOR: Oh, okay.
MR. SAVINO: The issue is if there's a
defect in the paperwork that we're taking a look
at, they would get three days to cure.
PRESIDENT TAYLOR: Oh.
MR. SAVINO: In terms of changing the
name, that is a absolutely curable defect. As a
matter of fact, it gets cured by the
commissioners if the person does not submit a new

name. And I'm not sure that that, uh, you know, that's again, something different, if we want to make them shorten the name, then they have I think five or seven days to, to try and do that. But if they don't, you guys pick the new name. So that, that's not going to -- that would not remove him from the ballot, or her.

PRESIDENT TAYLOR: I move that we send a letter asking them to correct the name.

MR. SAVINO: Mm-hmm.

PRESIDENT TAYLOR: Because I think they won't understand what's wrong with it if we don't -- you know, in other words, I think they'll make the same error in the future if we don't tell them now that the word is part of it and it makes it too long.

MR. SAVINO: Well, that will definitely go out. I think [unintelligible] [00:09:58] handles that. In terms of trying to fix, if you find this as a defect, as I said, they do have Mo for the Party People, they have Mo for the Party with People Party at the top, but it's in the body of the petition area where it comes out

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slightly different, Mo for the People as the name of the independent body. That's just one slight distinction, but --

other, I don't have other cover sheets or independent nominating petitions and I'm just wondering if the word party appears after all of them but the true intent is for the actual party to be Mo for the People and then party is just, like you said, you know, it's not Democratic Party Party or Republican Party Party, it's Democratic Party. So I, we can most certainly sent them the letter to cure, or you indicated we could also adopt the name Mo for the People.

MR. SAVINO: Right. But that would be after giving them a chance to correct it, which is a totally separate issue to a certain extent, about the potential defect. I mean it's on the petition, so that's not really curable. Uh, you know, if you were to find that as a defect.

PRESIDENT TAYLOR: How will they understand what is wrong?

MR. SAVINO: Well, if they were -- if

2	you rule that it's not a defect, then they won't
3	need to understand anything's wrong because it's
4	not. And if we do
5	PRESIDENT TAYLOR: I understand.
6	MR. SAVINO: Right.
7	PRESIDENT TAYLOR: But if we, if we do
8	rule it is a defect, what will they receive?
9	MR. SAVINO: They receive an overnight
10	letter. The content varies on what the issue is.
11	And, you know, it'll say petition, no, not
12	petition, you know, it'll say prima facie
13	basically on the CRU prima facie calendar that
14	the first paragraph wasn't entirely exactly as
15	the top and the cover sheet and the top of the
16	petition.
17	PRESIDENT TAYLOR: Ah, I see what you're
18	seeing.
19	COMMISSIONER MARMORATO: But it still is
20	Mo for the People.
21	PRESIDENT TAYLOR: It is.
22	MR. SAVINO: It says that's the name of
23	the independent body.
24	PRESIDENT TAYLOR: Right. I, I would, I

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2 think I would leave it alone.

COMMISSIONER MARMORATO: Yes.

MR. SAVINO: Okay.

COMMISSIONER MARMORATO: I'm inclined not to rule it as a defect and to -- I don't think there's any confusion to the voters. I think they understand that the name of the party is Mo for the People.

PRESIDENT TAYLOR: For the People is the name of the party and that Mo for the People is actually acceptable.

MR. SAVINO: Yeah, and just something else, that top party, I mean I've seen cases that were booted when they had the wrong election, the wrong designating as opposed to independent and, you know, the wrong date of the election, that stuff has been booted. You know, maybe I'll do some more research on, you know, to see about parts of that paragraph, not that I want to change your decision in any way, but you know, it might be something worth looking at. But as you probably know, I'm a little swamped with the canvas.

3	MR. SAVINO: But thank you,
4	commissioners for your time. So what we will do
5	is rule for no defect, and at some point, CRU
6	will come with you potentially asking to shorten
7	the party name. And if there's a motion to
8	adjourn?
9	COMMISSIONER MARMORATO: I move that we
10	adjourn.
11	PRESIDENT TAYLOR: Second it.
12	MR. SAVINO: Well, it's unanimous. Thank
13	you again, commissioners. My pleasure, and I'm
14	sure I'll see you all soon, well both of you
15	soon.
16	PRESIDENT TAYLOR: Yes, thank you so
17	much.
18	COMMISSIONER MARMORATO: And
19	Commissioner Taylor and counselor, if you could
20	stay on.
