3	MR. MICHAEL J. RYAN: Okay, we are live
4	streaming. Today is January 19, 2021. And this is
5	the weekly meeting of the Commissioners of
6	Elections in the City of New York. My name is
7	Michael Ryan. I'm the executive director. I will
8	start with the commissioner's roll call.
9	President Umane?
10	PRESIDENT FREDERIC UMANE: Here.
11	MR. RYAN: Secretary Camilo?
12	SECRETARY MIGUELINA CAMILO: Here.
13	MR. RYAN: Commissioner Araujo?
14	COMMISSIONER JOSE ARAUJO: Present.
15	MR. RYAN: Commissioner Marmorato?
16	COMMISSIONER GINO MARMORATO: Present,
17	good afternoon, everyone.
18	MR. RYAN: Good afternoon. Commissioner
19	Michel?
20	COMMISSIONER MICHAEL MICHEL: Present.
21	MR. RYAN: Commissioner Pepe-Souvenir?
22	COMMISSIONER PEPE-SOUVENIR: Present,
23	good afternoon.
24	MR. RYAN: Good afternoon. Commissioner

8	here, thank you.
9	MR. RYAN: Thank you. Commissioner
10	Townsend?
11	COMMISSIONER TIFFANY TOWNSEND: Good
12	afternoon, present.
13	MR. RYAN: Good afternoon. Commissioner
14	Zaccone?
15	COMMISSIONER JOHN WM. ZACCONE: Good
16	afternoon, present.
17	MR. RYAN: Good afternoon. As I stated
18	earlier, I am Michael Ryan, I'm the executive
19	director. Also joined on this conference via
20	conference are counsels to the commissioners,
21	Steven Denkberg and Kenneth Moltner. And
22	elsewhere in the building is Georgea Kontzamanis,
23	operations manager.
24	In addition to items one and two on the

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that needs to be reported out on and Mr. Suss is here and will be called up at the appropriate time. And executive management doesn't have any personnel or litigation matters. Do any of the commissioners have either of those two things that wish to be discussed in executive session? I quess my question is, is there a reason to go into executive session today?

COMMISSIONER PEPE-SOUVENIR: Yeah, I'd like to, I sent some, an e-mail this morning I'd like to discuss in executive session.

MR. RYAN: Okay. Is it a personnel matter?

COMMISSIONER PEPE-SOUVENIR: brief discussion, yes, personnel matter.

MR. RYAN: Alright. Thank you very much, commissioner. Okay. So we will add three, commissioners' finance committee report and executive session for personnel. Okay. So, item number one is there is a special election in the 24th Council District, the election day is scheduled for February 2nd. However, early voting January 19, 2021

this coming week. And with respect to, I know

commences on Saturday, January 23rd, so that's

Commissioner Araujo had some questions or wanted

addressed regarding training.

So, the training for this election will be tomorrow and it will be a video conference type training like we're doing now. Given the timing of the election and the ability to access individuals and the fact that the tasks of the regular poll workers are identical for rank choice voting as they would be in an election that does not implicate rank choice voting, the coordinators will be trained. I believe it's also Queens' intention to have staff members at each of the poll sites since it's for early voting and for election day. We'll double check that, but since it's a small enough election that would be possible.

So, I'll hold this up. I know it really can't be seen that well, but this is an example of the materials that have been circulated, that have been worked on by Ms. Vazquez and other members of the staff with respect to rank choice

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voting and is part of the public education program that I believe was a presentation was made to the public education committee regarding these materials and videos and other things that we have on our website. And so we are again supplementing the public outreach portion of this process that is required by the city charter to be done by the campaign finance board. As well, I understand that our ADA unit is integrated into that process by the CFB to offer assistance and to help make some presentations with respect to the accessibility community.

So we're working as much hand in glove as we can with the campaign finance board to make sure that things get done properly. And we have our own responsibilities as voters come into the poll sites. So, the idea was to keep the materials that will be distributed. And so what I held up is going to be available in all of the locations early voting and election day sites and given to the voter with the ballot. So this will be a handout that goes to the voter and explains the rank choice voting to them. And the training

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that the coordinators will receive will be consistent with the information set forth on the handout that's going to the voters. So if the voters have any more detailed questions, they will, we will be able to address them, but that will be done through the coordinators rather than through the individual poll workers.

This will give us an opportunity to A, get the training done that we need to get done for the February 2nd election, but also to see what works, what doesn't and what needs to be tweaked and what needs to be expanded to, because we will have two more opportunities to conduct a rank choice voting election before the full citywide election in June.

So we have another one coming up in Queens. Queens will be experts at this by the time June rolls around, having done two and then the Bronx will have an event on March 23rd involving two separate districts. So, we're taking this as an opportunity to do our best effort but also to evaluate that effort and to take a look at what we need to do moving forward.

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So I don't know, and excuse me, I'll address, since Commissioner Araujo was the one that brought this up, Commissioner Araujo is that presentation sufficient for your purposes or do you have any other questions?

COMMISSIONER ARAUJO: No, it is. Thank you for that. I just did have some, an additional question. I don't know if you addressed it.

Whether or not that supplemental information to the voter, to those voting in our special election, is that up on our website in a place where it's conspicuous, it can be reviewed if anyone goes to our website?

MR. RYAN: There is information up on the website. Ms. Kontzamanis, do you have the specific location? I'm trying to picture it. We do have a rank choice voting button on the website and I'm just not visualizing it presently.

MS. KONTZAMANIS: We do, and we have for the special elections as well.

MR. RYAN: Okay.

COMMISSIONER ARAUJO: Great. Thank you

1 January 19, 2021 2 very much. MR. RYAN: And if --3 4 PRESIDENT UMANE: Could I just ask that that be circulated to all the commissioners? I 5 know apparently it was reviewed by the committee, 6 7 but I don't recall, and again, I'm not as young as I used to be with creeping senility, but I 8 9 don't recall having, if it'd been circulated to 10 the commissioners and theoretically approved by 11 the full board. 12 COMMISSIONER TAYLOR: [unintelligible] 13 [00:13:25]. 14 PRESIDENT UMANE: And I know we're under 15 significant timeframes but at some point, at 16 least it would be helpful to see it, so that, so 17 if the others of us had comments, we would have 18 an opportunity to provide them. 19 MR. RYAN: Okay. We will certainly --20 this one is a one-pager but what I'll do is I'll 21 have Ms. Vazquez forward all of the materials. I 22 believe there are links and videos and things 2.3 that can be done. So we can send this one pager

out fairly quickly, and then I'll have Ms.

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Vazquez send out the balance of the materials.

PRESIDENT UMANE: Okay, great. Thank you.

MR. RYAN: Alright. Thank you. So, that concludes executive management's presentation with respect to the 24th Council District. Did any commissioners have any other questions regarding that subject? Secretary Camilo, first time I get to say that in an open meeting.

SECRETARY CAMILO: Thank you. So I just wanted to put an idea out there, because our website, which is wonderful and has a lot of data on rank choice voting, you can see a sample ballot if you are a voter that is registered for that district in Queens, right. If we can maybe think about making that sample ballot, which displays what rank choice voting will look like for the first time, if we can make that available to any voter that wants to view it, just so the voters get a sense from now of what that ballot looks like, even though it's not going to have information that they're going to put on.

MR. RYAN: Okay. So you're looking then

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for a static .PDF and then ultimately, one in machine readable format?

SECRETARY CAMILO: We have a graphic right now, and it's on display on our home page, of, you know, the five columns and what rank choice ballot voting ballot could look like. But if that ballot is available for those voters that are registered in the 24th District, if there is a way to make a similar ballot available to any voter. If I want to look at it right now, right, that's just something that I would recommend and maybe we, the commissioners, could have more discussion on that before we actually make the decision. But --

MR. RYAN: So, commissioner can I ask you a question? We had been, ESNS had provided us a sample ballot back when we had to respond to the City Council and the mayor and publish our report, which is attached in that. And I believe, if my memory serves me correctly, it was based on the last mayoral election, and they just did a layout that way. Now, in order to make sure that the website is fully accessible, we would have to

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reduce that to a machine readable format as well and that could be taken care of. My question to you is would a .PDF like that suffice, or would you prefer something purely fictional? Like we have done with other sample ballots, where no candidate names are mentioned, etc.?

SECRETARY CAMILO: I think if you could refresh our recollection as to what that document looks like and that could be circulated, because I want the, I would want the commissioners to look at whatever sample we use.

MR. RYAN: Got you, okay. I will do that. I will circulate that. My memory serves me that it was based on the contest list from the previous mayoral election four years ago, or three years ago now. But in the past, typically, when we've done sample ballots like that for educational purposes, they've been fictional, as opposed to using real names.

PRESIDENT UMANE: Whatever's easier but I would recommend using a fictional name.

MR. RYAN: Right. Okay.

PRESIDENT UMANE: But if it creates a

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problem and delay and all of that within the upcoming elections, I would go with whatever we can do the quickest, the idea being that the voters get a chance to see what it's going to look like.

MS. KONTZAMANIS: Mr. Ryan, I believe we already have one created that the CFB and other groups are already using to show their constituency what the ballot looks like.

MR. RYAN: Perfect. And Commissioner
Umane, to answer your concern, for the upcoming
elections, the voters that are actually voting in
those districts will have a specific information
available to them for those districts and I think
Commissioner Camilo's concern is one of the ways
that you access your ballot online is typing in
your address. And so if you don't have a contest
in your district, and you type in your address,
it's going to come up with no contest. So this is
kind of to fill that gap.

So the actual voters that have a contest, they're covered. And this would be for everybody else, in case people looking for

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2	general information about RCV between now and
3	June.
4	COMMISSIONER TOWNSEND: I think that's a
5	great idea, and I'm happy to convene a, if it's
6	necessary for the public education committee to
7	meet as well too, I'm happy to convene a meeting.
8	MR. RYAN: Okay.
9	PRESIDENT UMANE: Is there any news on
10	any of the litigation regarding rank choice
11	voting and are we going to do it or not do it?
12	MR. RYAN: Well, until we get a decision
13	from a court of competent jurisdiction, we forge
14	ahead. And so
15	PRESIDENT UMANE: Okay. So we haven't
16	been stayed is what I just wondered.
17	MR. RYAN: No, we have not been stayed.
18	And it does not appear that that particular
19	litigation is moving with a sense of urgency.
20	But, you know, we're on the outside looking in on
21	that one a little bit.
22	COMMISSIONER TOWNSEND: Great.
23	MR. RYAN: Okay. Yeah, anyone? Alright.
24	Number two, we need an appointment of a

6	SECRETARY CAMILO: And when will they be
7	scheduled?
8	MR. RYAN: Well, that is typically left

10	be serving on that committee. We have to, we just
11	need to know because we do have a 24-hour notice
12	requirement, which would have to be completed by
13	tomorrow for Thursday.
14	SECRETARY CAMILO: So
15	COMMISSIONER MARMORATO: This is
16	Commissioner Marmorato, I will agree to represent
17	the Republicans for this committee meeting.
18	PRESIDENT UMANE: Thank you,
19	Commissioner Marmorato, you're so selected.
20	SECRETARY CAMILO: And I can serve for
21	the dems. I don't know, Mr. Ryan, if you need a
22	date from us now.
23	MR. RYAN: Oh, I'm sorry. The date is
24	going to be January 21st. Then we would just need

3	PRESIDENT UMANE: Thursday, it's
4	Thursday.
5	MR. RYAN: Thursday, the 21st and then a
6	time convenient to both Commissioner Marmorato
7	and Secretary Camilo.
8	SECRETARY CAMILO: Can we say 3:00 p.m.?
9	MR. RYAN: 3:00 p.m. is fine with us.
10	That's up to you guys.
11	COMMISSIONER MARMORATO: Can we do 3:30,
12	Commissioner Camilo?
13	SECRETARY CAMILO: I'm not available at
14	3:30. If a dem wants to step in.
15	COMMISSIONER MARMORATO: Can we do 3:15?
16	SECRETARY CAMILO: 3:15
17	COMMISSIONER MARMORATO: I have
18	something at 2:30 which I just don't want to run
19	over, but if 3:00 o'clock works, I'll be sure to
20	be complete by 3:00 p.m., so 3:00 o'clock.
21	COMMISSIONER TAYLOR: I can sub for
22	Commissioner Camilo.
23	SECRETARY CAMILO: That's fine. If 3:30
24	Thursday and I could designate you, Commissioner

2 Taylor, thank you.

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COMMISSIONER TAYLOR: Excellent.

MR. RYAN: Okay. So 3:30 then, alright, very well. Okay. So that's taken care of. And then, Mr. Suss, if you could please step up, and there is a finance committee report. Commissioner Umane, you participated in that and as well did Commissioner Camilo, if either one of you wants to take the brief summary or should we have Mr. Suss, do his presentation first?

PRESIDENT UMANE: Well, I can do it quickly.

MR. RYAN: Okay.

PRESIDENT UMANE: We have been asked to, and the committee recommends a contract with Iron Mountain to work for six months for special elections and various other trucking duties for the Queens elections that are coming up. And Iron Mountain is a well known company that handles lots of things and lots of trucking assignments in the financial industry. And they're known as a very reliable storage and trucking company. And this is a preliminary, temporary six-month, up to

2	\$600,000 contract in order to handle the trucking
3	requirements for the Queens elections. And this
4	has been vetted and approved by the committee and
5	I would recommend it as a community
6	recommendation to the full board.
7	MR. RYAN: Are there any objections to
8	the committee recommendation? Hearing none, the
9	committee report is adopted and then that leaves
10	us
11	MR. SHERWIN SUSS: Thank you,
12	commissioners.
13	MR. RYAN: Thank you. That leaves us
14	with two other matters. One, electing the next
15	meeting date, and two, adjourning into executive
16	session.
17	PRESIDENT UMANE: Well, I would we
18	should meet on the 26th at 1:30 as our next
19	meeting date, and I would move to adjourn to
20	executive session for executive session on
21	personnel and possibly litigation.
22	SECRETARY CAMILO: Second, I will
23	second, sorry, commissioner.
24	MR. RYAN: It sounded like you said

1 January 19, 2021 psych, which was a childhood thing that we used 2 to do when I was a kid. But it was seconded. 3 Alright, so are there any objections to going 4 5 into executive session?
