3	PRESIDENT FREDERIC UMANE: Okay, this is
4	the meeting of the Board of Elections for
5	February 9, 2021. My name is Fred Umane. I am the
6	president for the year 2021, and the Manhattan
7	Republican. I'd ask my colleagues to introduce
8	themselves, I guess starting with the Bronx
9	commissioners.
10	SECRETARY MIGUELINA CAMILO: Good
11	afternoon, Miguelina Camilo for the Bronx Dem.
12	COMMISSIONER GINO MARMORATO: Good
13	afternoon, everyone. Gino Marmorato, Bronx
14	Republican.
15	PRESIDENT UMANE: And the Brooklyn
16	commissioners?
17	COMMISSIONER SIMON SHAMOUN: Simon

19	SECRETARY CAMILO: Commissioner Pepe-

18	PRESIDENT UMANE: Good, thanks, so we're
19	all here. We do not seem to have an elaborate
20	agenda today. The first thing is a draft of the
21	RCV manual canvas procedures that was sent out to
22	us. Perhaps Mr. Naudus could give us just a brief
23	explanation of how the manual count is supposed
24	to work and then we can perhaps entertain a

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motion to adopt them.

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MR. NAUDUS: Good afternoon,

commissioners. Basically, the premise with the RCV procedures is all of the ballots need to be gathered into one place. The procedures go into detail about how to keep track, make sure you can put the ballots back to which bin or ED they come from. Once the ballots are all together, they're counted and then the grand total, and then the process of moving them to basically the voters first choice to the individual candidates, write in or if no choice is clear, to the exhausted box. Once the ballots have been redistributed by a bipartisan team, it's each, for each of the individual candidate, write in or exhausted box, those boxes are counted to determine totals.

If an individual candidate has received more than the 50 percent plus one vote that's required, then the process stops and you have your winner. Otherwise, the box -- the candidate that received the lowest number of votes is deemed eliminated. Their votes are then taken from them and retransferred ballot by ballot to

1 February 9, 2021 each voter's second or next available choice, 2 which could be one of the other candidates or if 3 4 it's a candidate that's already eliminated, moved 5 on and exhausted. That process moves until there are only two candidates left with ballots and 6 7 then out of those candidates, the one with the majority of the votes, or basically the one with 8 9 the most votes of those two is then declared the 10 winner of the process. 11 PRESIDENT UMANE: Okay. 12 MR. NAUDUS: Thank you, commissioners. 13 PRESIDENT UMANE: Okay. And all of that 14 is supposed to happen in what? Five minutes or so? With over a million ballots? 15 MR. NAUDUS: With people and manual, 16 17 depending on the amount of votes, the ballots. 18 PRESIDENT UMANE: Okay. Is there a 19 motion to adopt the proposed draft canvas 20 procedures? 21 COMMISSIONER ARAUJO: Yeah, this is 22 Commissioner Araujo. I move that we adopt the 2.3 procedures. 24 PRESIDENT UMANE: Is there a second?

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2 SECRETARY CAMILO: I would second that.

PRESIDENT UMANE: Okay. Is there any opposition? Any abstentions, okay.

MR. SAVINO: Commissioner, if I may, I thought it was worth pointing out that Maine apparently was one of the first states to do RCV and they resolve ties with drawing lots. In this, we have a coin toss, we looked into it. I know there's a coin toss done upstate. I don't remember the specifics. But there also is legislation that has been signed by both houses that does also talk about drawing lots. So if that passes, we will obviously have that section changed, well, if it gets signed by the governor, I should say.

PRESIDENT UMANE: Okay. I had heard they were going with either foul shots or arm wrestling, but I'm not sure, I [unintelligible]

MR. SAVINO: Again, that's only if there's a tie, so.

PRESIDENT UMANE: Okay. Does anybody else have any business? There does not seem to be

17	our executive session, so thank you all, and
18	we'll see you all next week. We'll all go into
19	executive session.
