5	PRESIDENT UMANE: Okay, good morning.
6	Today is day two of the hearings on matters
7	relating to designating petitions for the June
8	22, 2021 primary elections in the city of New
9	York. Notice of today's hearing was given on
10	March 2, 2021 with the issuance of the filing
11	calendar for the primary elections.
12	All hearings will be conducted remotely
13	and we ask for everyone's patience and
14	cooperation. My name is Fred Umane. I am the
15	Manhattan Republican commissioner and am
16	president of the Board of Commissioners the
17	calendar year 2021. I will begin today's hearing
18	with the commissioners' roll call. Secretary
19	Camilo?
20	SECRETARY MIGUELINA CAMILO: Good
21	morning, present.
22	PRESIDENT UMANE: Commissioner Araujo?
23	COMMISSIONER JOSE ARAUJO: Good morning,
24	present.

PRESIDENT UMANE: Commissioner Townsend?

COMMISSIONER TIFFANY TOWNSEND: Good

morning, present.

PRESIDENT UMANE: And last but not least, Commissioner Zaccone?

COMMISSIONER JOHN WM. ZACCONE: Good morning, thank you for that, present.

PRESIDENT UMANE: Also joining us today from executive management is Dawn Sandow, the deputy executive director, Pamela Perkins, administrative manager, and Georgea Kontzamanis, operations manager and director of productions. Ken Moltner and Steven Denkberg, counsels to the commissioners are also here, as well as general counsel Hemalee Patel and deputy general counsel Raphael Savino and Matt Graves, Rayvon Weaver, and Tom Sattie from our Candidate Records Unit are also here and helping.

An updated hearings calendar, as well as today's ledgers, was posted to our website last night. Today, we will conduct the hearings for citywide specification from objections calendar, all King, Queens and Manhattan County matters and

after the citywide, there's one Bronx enrollment matter that we're going to hear. We have a full calendar and ask for everyone's cooperation to keep the calendar moving and I will do my best to enforce that. So let's begin with the citywide specifications of objection calendar. Please call that calendar and give everybody a chance to get it open. Okay. If you could all that calendar, please.

MS. HEMALEE PATEL: Good morning. We're going to start with NY53-1 in the matter of objections by Robert L. Morgan III, to the petition of Adam Oremland for the mayor of the City of New York, number of signatures required 2,250, total number of valid signatures, 1,209.

PRESIDENT UMANE: Are there any appearances?

MS. KONTZAMANIS: Yes, there are appearances. Robert Morgan for the objector, and Peter Tilem for the candidate.

PRESIDENT UMANE: Okay. Mr. Tilem, you seem to be short. Do you have anything to add, or perhaps --

MS. KONTZAMANIS: Just give me one second, commissioner, just give us a second to get them into the room, sir.

PRESIDENT UMANE: I'm sorry. Okay.

MS. KONTZAMANIS: Commissioners, Mr.

Tilem and Mr. Morgan have joined.

PRESIDENT UMANE: Okay. Mr. Tilem,
you're here for the candidate. The candidate
seems to be somewhat short. Do you have something
to add or a list of potential errors that we can
deal with?

SECRETARY CAMILO: You're on mute, sir.

MR. PETER TILEM: Okay. Thank you, I apologize. Good morning, commissioners, I appreciate you hearing me. The answer is yes we have. First of all, I want to start off with some objections to the specifications. Number one, each one requires that the individual pages of objections be numbered sequentially. That is in addition to the sheet numbers and we believe --

PRESIDENT UMANE: We don't, Mr. Tilem, I don't want to cut you off, but we've dealt with that issue yesterday.

MR. TILEM: Okay. And was it resolved in favor --

PRESIDENT UMANE: And we felt that if it's sufficiently indicated as to the page and the volume number, that that was sufficient.

MR. TILEM: Okay. That seems to conflict with the rule, the way it's written but I understand it's the commissioner's rulings. I would also note that these objections appear not to be timely. We were not served with general objections, but it would appear that the general objections were due, according to Rule G and according to H11, the general objections were due no later than March 27th and that would mean that the specifications would have had to be due by April 2nd.

PRESIDENT UMANE: Okay, well let's check the filing dates.

MR. TILEM: Okay.

PRESIDENT UMANE: I would ask the clerks to check the filing dates, please. When was the last petition volume or the cover sheet filed for Mr. Oremland's petition?

18	commissioner, please. Alright. So it was the, the
19	designating petition was filed on the 24th and
20	the general was due on March 29th, Monday.
21	PRESIDENT UMANE: And when was it file?
22	MR. LEHMAN: The 29th, it was timely.
23	PRESIDENT UMANE: Okay. And the specs?
24	MR. LEHMAN: Specs were filed on April

7	1,000 signatures. Do you have 1,000 errors?
8	MR. TILEM: I do not have 1,000 errors,
9	but based upon what we reviewed, we have found a
10	fairly significant number of errors, somewhere in
11	the range

13	1,000 it's not going to help you, sir.
14	MR. TILEM: As I indicated, we got
15	retained late and we have not been able to get
16	through all the signatures at this point.

19	anything to add?

21	request that the commissioners adopt the clerks'

So please make a very brief statement and please do not consider me to be rude, but if you're not talking on the issues before us, I may cut you off after a minute or two. So please make your statement, okay.

MS. TIRSCHWELL: Okay. I'm only going to speak for a minute or two, so I hope you will afford me that opportunity. Thank you. So I haven't met most of you. I'm a single mom and I'm also the chief financial officer of Foundation House, which is an addiction treatment company. I've been dealing with a mental health crisis inflicted on young people throughout this country as well as my own children. I'm an outsider, and the only Republican woman on the ballot for mayor. The party has gone to great lengths to ensure that I remain an outsider and to limit the

right of the rank and file members to choose their nominee.

These are unusual times that call for unusual measures to maintain the civility of our democracy that rests on the right to vote. We have frequently used COVID to stifle liberties, so why not use it to support the right to vote and send a strong message against the tactics that have been used here to keep me off the ballot. Thank you.

PRESIDENT UMANE: Okay, Mr. Mandelker, please go ahead.

MR. MANDELKER: Yes, sir. Mr. Umane and commissioners, thank you for giving me an opportunity to address you. The process of an insider like Mr. Mateo challenging the signatures obtained during the pandemic by a first time candidate is shameful. We will not dignify the process by dealing with it on the merits. Ms. Tirschwell wants to be quit of Mr. Mateo and his [unintelligible] [00:26:40].

The candidate's petition did state the incorrect date of November 2nd for the primary, which will be held on June 22nd, and the cover sheet that was filed did not list any volume numbers. An NCN dated March 26, 2021 was sent to the candidate and no corrected cover sheet was received by the board. It is the opinion of counsel that the petition should be deemed invalid.

Mino being a diminutive of Camino and she is widely and popularly known as Mino Lora.

Before you, you should also have documents including an affidavit signed by Mino Lora as well as proof she's held herself out opening and notoriously, consistently in a bona fide good faith manner as Mino Lora throughout her life. This board also allowed Ms. Mino Lora to appear in the special election on the ballot as Mino Lora in the special election in March for this same seat.

I know that the standard as articulated in case law and particularly the court of appeals decision in the matter of Eisenberg v. Strasser and as well as cases even done as of last year, it's well established in case law that a candidate's name may appear on the designating petition and the ballot differently than it appears on the candidate's voter registration, as long as there is no intent to mislead potential signatories and voters. And there's no showing that any voters or signers were misled. There is absolutely zero chance that anybody would be

2.3

misled. Mino Lora, she already ran an election in March in the special as Mino Lora, voters know her as Mino Lora, she's not pretending to be anybody else. She has submitted an affidavit to this commission to that effect. You'll see media articles, even a letter from the governor, in her professional capacity, as a non-profit leader, calling her Mino Lara.

So I would say respectfully commissioners, I would ask that you allow Mino Lora to be on the ballot as Mino Lora. There is no enrollment issue. In fact, she is a registered Democrat at the same address on her petition. You should have the voter registration in front of you. For the record, the voter ID is 412116769. And I ask that this enrollment issue be resolved in that this board accepts Mino Lora as Mino Lora on the ballot the way it's on the petition.

PRESIDENT UMANE: Any appearances?

MR. SATTIE: There are. Bernard Alter for the objector and Aaron Foldenauer for the candidate.

MR. FOLDENAUER: Good afternoon, commissioners, Aaron Foldenauer for Raimondo Graziano.

COMMISSIONER ARAUJO: The clerks' report has you short by 41, do you have an exception list?

MR. FOLDENAUER: I do, but there's a similar [unintelligible] [03:54:41] fatal issue with the specification. Again, it's in connection with the specification of objections form. I did sent a document under my letterhead to the

Here, the objector did not comply with the rules, did not fill out that objection information, the contact information completely, and omitted the candidate's contact person's email address and thus the specification is fatal.

COMMISSIONER ARAUJO: Does the specification include the person's telephone numbers and fax numbers? [unintelligible]
[03:55:57] because they forgot to put, or did not put in [unintelligible] [03:56:01] that would render the specification defective. But there's other contact information in here.

MR. FOLDENAUER: The, the, let me look at the specification of objections form now that was filed. The objection forms includes the candidate's contact person's phone number. It does not include a fax number, I don't think there was one in fact on the cover sheet, but there was an email address for the contact person on the cover sheet. And the specification of objections form specifically says to list the candidate's contact person, it says parenthesis, from the petition cover sheet. The petition cover sheet lists the name, the address, the phone number and an email address. The objector failed to include that contact information specifically omitting the email address, thus not complying with the form and not complying with the rules, therefore the specification fails in its entirety.

PRESIDENT UMANE: I don't think that that's -- I think there's sufficient information. I don't think that that's a valid objection. If the information is readily available on the objection, whether it's repeated on each single

page does not strike me as something that would be sufficient to invalidate an objection, as long as the information was provided on the cover sheet and it was clear who the person was -- who the objector was on each page. The omission of a fax number or a email address on each page of the objection doesn't strike me as being sufficient to invalidate an objection.

MR. FOLDENAUER: I appreciate the president's comments. I would however refer you to Rule H2, which specifically addresses the situation here and it says that the specification should include the name, the mailing address of the contact person. The very next sentence, it should also include any telephone numbers, fax numbers, and/or email addresses which can be used to provide notice regarding [unintelligible] [03:58:38] of the specifications. So again, it's specifically right here Mr. President and commissioners in Rule H2. And I'll note the reason why this is.

As the commissioners know, time is of the essence with these clerks' reports.

Candidates do not have very much time to receive the clerks' reports, digest them and put together their lists. That's why email addresses are now required. Here it wasn't provided and it's right in the rules. So I would ask the president and the commissioners to reconsider the initial comment I just got based on the text of the rule and given that time is of the essence, which is why an email notice is required.

COMMISSIONER ARAUJO: Mr. Foldenauer, I understand what you're saying, but the language says and/or, the [unintelligible] [03:59:26] sufficient with including it there, so I don't believe that it's sufficient argument to knock out the specification.

MR. FOLDENAUER: There's some feedback, so I honestly couldn't hear very well. Could someone repeat that or could you repeat that? I couldn't hear.

SAVINO: Commissioners, for the sake of economy, as you can see on the report, we addressed QN82-1, QN84-1, QN85-1, QN86-1, 87-1, 89, 90-1, 92, 95, 96-1, 98, 99, 100-1, 101, 102, 105, 108-1 and 110-1. Listed on the counsel's report mentions the name of the candidate, the office sought and the objector. I can go through that long list if you wish. With respect to our findings, we note that the first specification is identical on all of the objections. It basically says the face of all of the petition sheets contain additional information that is not contained in statute Election Law 6-132. The additional information consists of numbers that are not germane to the petition and are misleading and confusing to the signers. The form is defective and void prima facie. That is the specification.

Well, upon examining the petitions, in the middle of each page on each petition volume, apparently submitted by Mr. Mayo, there is a random series of unexplained numbers under the

names of where the names of where the candidates are listed. There is one example included in the clerks' report but there are some other petitions that contain an even longer laundry list of numbers, quite frankly, something I haven't seen before.

In any event, there's no mention of such markings in election law section 132, which describes the form of petition that shall be followed. The numbers on the petitions, similar to the ones that are copied on the report, do not appear to be relevant to the petition volumes and as noted above, could certainly confuse or mislead the signers.

As stated in the matter of Roberta James v. Westchester Board of Elections, departing from the statutory language on the petition does present peril. The situation appears to be akin to where a candidate fails to sufficiently describe the office being sought. Again, there's other citations there, there's a long laundry list of well established cases in that regard.

But I will note in the case of Lozano, the court

said in such situations, the description must preclude any reasonable probability of confusing or deceiving the signers, voters, or the Board of Elections. The same standard should be applied here. The instamatter is also similar to where a petition contains unexplained material alterations to a witness statement in which the entire page is invalidated.

In light of the fact that the unexplained series of numbers could confuse the signers, voters, and as we said, boards of elections, it is the opinion of the office of general counsel that these extraneous marking should be considered a prima facie defect. As such, this office did not reach other specifications of objections. There were additional ones on many of the specs. One, for example, was that there were multiple cover sheets submitted in an effort to intentionally deceive potential objectors and there were allegations that the -- there were candidates included on the petitions without their authority. And those are our findings. And with

that, I'll --

And as you all know, because Governor Cuomo, on February 16th, give the option of each county to decide well, you can postpone county reorg, so we did not know what official county

Republican Party of Queens was going to do since they filed basically notice of postponement for March 1st, at 4:47 p.m., right before the first day of petition. And we weren't able to get a copy of the decision obviously, until a few days later. So by that time, we already started collecting some signatures.

So we either needed to decide to change the entire format or just go ahead with the format we had. Now, the argument is this. First of all, the Board of Elections counsel's memorandum ignored the language of the election law in 6-132 and 6-134, that substantial compliance is sufficient and the law is to be liberally construed to keep candidates on the ballot. Now, section 6-132 of the Election Law provides in valid part that each sheet of the designating petition shall contain the following information, it shall be substantially the same form. We did. Section 6-134 refers to candidates for one or more offices it states in subsection ten that provisions of the section shall be liberally construed, not inconsistent substantial

compliance therefore. We did. The prevention of fraud and there's no fraud. John Haggerty is not alleging any fraud, just confusion.

Now, the counsel's memorandum ignores these relevant provisions of the law which are to keep petitions from being rejected for minor variations from the form. That's what John Haggerty is saying. These are minor variations and he wants to reject them all. In this case, it is clear from the face of the petition that there was substantial compliance within the boxes where the candidates are named, the petition follows the form exactly. In the witness signature portion at the end of the petition, the petition follows the form exactly.

The Board of Elections counsel ignores the relevant case law. The relevant cases are ignored in counsel memorandum. In Caffery v.

Lawley, the Appellate Division interpreted the word substantially in the election law to hold that omission of county from the description of public office did not invalidate the petition.

The court warned -- Mr. Haggerty, please -- that

voter suppression stating that enrolled voters who seek to designate candidates should be given effect if possible and not frustrated by technical objections relating to matters not of vital and mandatory nature. Mr. Haggerty [unintelligible] [05:17:09].

Similarly, Murray v. [unintelligible]
[05:17:13]. There, the Appellate Division
reversed a decision that a petition was invalid
that failed to state the name of the town in the
space entitled public office and party position.
The court stated that while the town was omitted,
the designating petition read as a whole clearly
shows that its town involved was [unintelligible]
[05:17:33]. In other words, the petition read as
a whole makes it clear what the office is and
what the town is. And the minor [unintelligible]
[05:17:42] will not invalidate the petition.

So you've got a string of numbers, an ID number printed in here. I think the case is very clear. There's one thing you can't really mess around is the form of the petition. In fact, the board, both the city board and the state board, give you a prescribed sample online and it doesn't say please add whatever you want here in any place. And if you add information to any legal document, you can't just drop it into a legal document whenever you want, whatever.

So, you know, his list of -- he kind of belies his own point by saying this is the list of districts everyone, this is a list of districts, exactly the point. It's confusing, it's a list of other districts.

COMMISSIONER MICHEL: Mr. Mayo, this is Commissioner Michel. I have a question because I

The clerk has taken me off, did not make a prima facie based on the printer's error letter. The fact that I filed a printer's error letter does not extend in any way, shape or form, the time to file the specifications. But if the commissioners want to go beyond that, the specification itself, the cover page of the specification, it says petition numbers and instead of saying the volume numbers, it says one, two, three. That's all it says, one, two, three. Because there's a second prima facie issue, because the specification cover sheet says that it's directed to volumes one, two, and

But most importantly, I'd say in terms of the technicalities of the specifications, the front page, in the middle of the front page, when it says petition volume identification number, it says one, two, three. That's not a proper specification. So this board should not go beyond that. I can also just tell you that the clerk did process the specifications and found that I had found 702 out of 788 valid signatures. But I don't even think the board has be get that far, because not only was it late, not only was it late, but the cover sheet doesn't have the volume numbers and therefore, it -- and I believe earlier today, I was listening to another decision you made where it was I think in Queens

where it said QN, you know, 2021 and it had the wrong last three numbers of the volume that it was addressed to and you found the specification to be fatally defective. Well here it only says one, two, three, so it's fatally defective for that reason.

PRESIDENT UMANE: Mr. Winestock, do you have something to say about that?

MR. WINESTOCK: Well, we, I was asked to respond today and prepare an argument as to whether or not the filings were timely, and I submit that I cited the correct statute and the filings were timely. I would also point out that Section 6-132 subdivision 2 of the election law specifically says that the town or city or in the case of New York City has to have the county, it has to be in the subscribing witness identification statement, so the board is bound by statute here. And more recently, the case that Commissioner Umane brought up Stoppenbach v. Sweeney is also a Court of Appeals case. So I

think the board has to err towards the Court of Appeals because it's the highest court on two cases rather than anything lower courts have done.

I also want to say that Board of Elections, as New York City Board of Elections has an extensive precedence of doing this, upholding these rules. One case specifically that comes to mind is David Garland in 2012 was knocked off the ballot for Congress when the subscribing witness Elizabeth McVeigh failed to write Richmond County where she resided, and instead had New York County in the subscribing witness identification statement. I also want to point out that there is a substantial possibility of confusion here, because the address says Long Island City of New York on the address rather than Queens County, so it doesn't even say Queens anywhere on the subscribing witness statement. I also want to say that a quick review of the name of the witness Xal Zang [phonetic] shows that there's several Xal Zangs registered to vote in New York City. I found one actually in every
